Project Ruppantar was initiated by Gem & Jewellery Skill Council of India (GJSCI) by signing an MOU with Delhi Prison and India International Bridges to Justice, India (IBJ).

Project Rupaantar aims to empower the inmates of jail through skills and making them self-reliant, giving them fresh perspective towards life.

In the pilot phase of this project, 78 inmates have already been trained and certified and furthermore, 2<sup>nd</sup> batch on imitation jewellery is starting from 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2018.

In this project, we aim to train 840 candidates over next one year in job roles like, hand-sketch designing, stringing and beading etc.

This project will help to empower the inmates and make them more independent that will eventually rehabilitate them back into a normal life as a respected citizen.

After completion of training, the certified candidates are given quantum of work on regular basis by nearby imitation jewellery manufactures. Therefore, help them earn money while they're working in the jail. Once they are released from the jail, GJSCI, jointly with Jail authorities, will help them to become entrepreneurs.

The industry members are welcomed to contribute to this project by providing job work to these skilled and certified inmates. This will indirectly help in reducing crime rate and moreover help in **directing their minds** towards creativity through skilling.
